

TIE A TERRIFIC TIE




OVERVIEW:


Tying a tie can be tricky, but there are plenty of methods that make this potential dressing disaster so much easier.


Use this printable guide to the four-in-hand method so your tie comes out looking crisp and professional every time.



1  Drape the tie around your neck, under the uplifted collar, with the thin end on the left and the wide end on the right. The small end should fall about half the length of the wide end.

2  Cross the right side of the tie over the left. Bring the wide end back to the right, under the small end.

3  Fold the right side over the left one more time.

4  Bring the wide end up through the neck loop you formed underneath the tie.

5  Continue to pull the tie up through the loop and then back down through the loop you formed in the front of the tie.

6  Tighten the tie by pulling down on the wide end and pushing the knot up slightly. Pull the thin end to move the knot up to your collar, making sure the knot is straight and that the small end is still shorter than the wide end.
